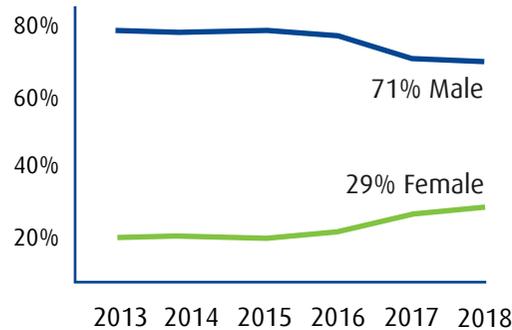

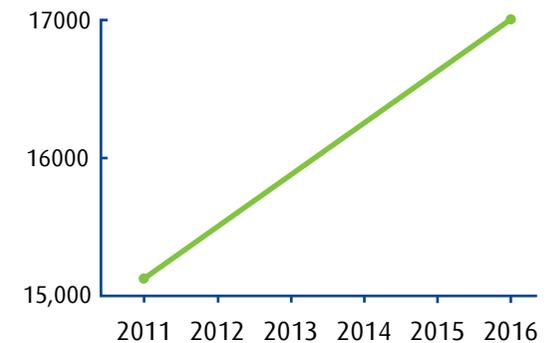

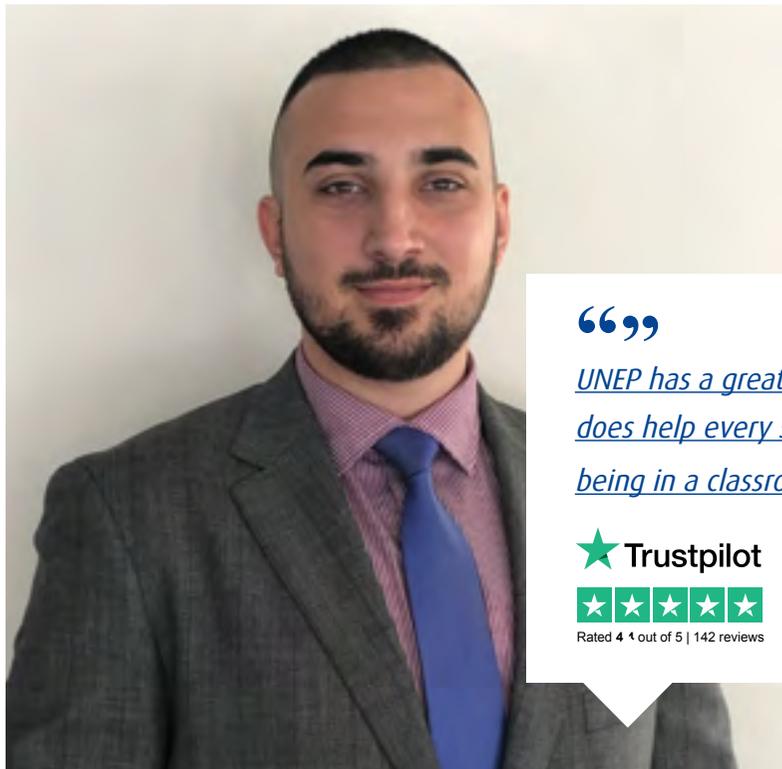

Learning outcomes

Core Units

BSBFIN501

Manage budgets and financial plans

This unit provides the skills and knowledge required to undertake financial management in an organisation or work area. It includes planning and implementing financial management approaches and supporting and evaluating effectiveness of financial management processes.

BSBPRC502

Manage supplier relationships

This unit provides the skills and knowledge required to manage relationships with suppliers of larger or multiple smaller procurement activities, where the relationship is of some significance to the organisation. It covers managing procurement agreements, resolving disagreements with suppliers, finalising agreements, and reviewing the performance of suppliers.

BSBWHS521

Ensure a safe workplace for a work area

This unit provides the skills and knowledge required to establish, maintain and evaluate an organisation's work health and safety (WHS) policies, procedures, and programs in a work area to ensure a safe workplace, according to WHS legislative requirements. It takes a systems approach and addresses compliance with relevant legislative requirements.

BSBOPS504

Manage business risk

This unit provides skills and knowledge required to manage business risks in a range of contexts across an organisation or for a specific business unit or area in any industry setting.

BSBSUS411

Implement and monitor environmentally sustainable work practices

This unit provides the skills and knowledge required to analyse and implement improvements to the environmental sustainability of work practices and monitor their effectiveness.

NAT10938001

Manage lifecycle services

This unit provides the outcomes required to manage the continuous processes of service provision to support facilities systems and practices whilst remaining sustainable.

NAT10938002

Develop and manage facility maintenance plans

This unit focuses on the requirement for facility managers to develop and manage facility maintenance plans for essential maintenance services and other services in a facility.

CPPDSM5030

Manage projects in the property industry

This unit of competency specifies the outcome required to plan, organise and monitor projects in the property industry. It requires the ability to establish project requirements, monitor quality assurance processes, and evaluate project processes and outcomes.

Elective Units A

CPCBC4012

Read and interpret plans and specifications

This unit of competency specifies the outcome required to read and interpret plans and specifications applicable to medium rise residential and commercial projects in order to inform estimation, planning, and supervisory activities.

CPPDSM5007

Coordinate construction or renovation of facilities

This unit of competency specifies the outcome required to coordinate the construction or renovation of facilities. It requires the ability to use appropriate consultative processes to determine construction or renovation requirements and to develop, monitor, and finalise a construction plan.

BSBTEC403

Apply digital solutions to work processes

This unit defines the skills, knowledge and outcomes to integrate digital technologies into common management practice.

MSS015020

Facilitate an energy audit

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to project manage an energy audit within a business environment, to provide a quantitative overview of energy performance and determining opportunities for improvement.

Learning outcomes (continued)

MSS405088

Plan, implement and monitor energy management

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to review energy use, and develop objectives, strategies and action plans for improved energy management in an organisation. It includes implementation and permanent monitoring as well as consultation and collaboration with key stakeholders throughout the process.

CPPDSM5001A

Advise on use and design of facilities

This unit of competency specifies the outcomes required to provide effective advice on the use and design of facilities to meet client needs. It requires the ability to conduct research to identify future facility requirements.

CPPDSM5029

Manage client relationships and networks in the property industry

This unit of competency specifies the outcomes required to maintain positive business relationships and active professional networks in the property industry. It applies to real estate agents, strata community managers, stock and station agents, Nationwide House Energy Rating Scheme (NatHERS) assessors, and home sustainability assessors.

CPPDSM5022A

Implement asset management plan

This unit of competency specifies the outcomes required to plan for the management of assets. It requires the ability to implement effective strategies to manage the operational, resource and maintenance needs of assets and to review and evaluate those strategies.

CPPDSM5011A

Determine space utilisation

This unit of competency specifies the outcomes required to develop design briefs for the use of space. It requires the ability to analyse client requirements, develop design concepts and prepare a design brief using appropriate technology.

CPPCSV5011A

Apply building code and standards to residential buildings

This unit of competency specifies the outcomes required to ensure that the building process complies with the Building Code of Australia (BCA) and relevant Australian standards. The unit applies to residential buildings and includes the evaluation and interpretation of building requirements, classification of buildings according to the BCA criteria and strategies for compliance.

CPPREP4123

Manage tenancy

This unit specifies the skills and knowledge required to manage a tenancy. It includes timely and effective communication with tenant, landlord and other stakeholders and the management of rent payments, arrears, routine inspections, repairs, maintenance, tenancy renewals, rent increases and tenancy agreement breaches.

NB This unit applies to people currently working in or seeking to work in real estate. State or territory licensing requirements may apply to this unit.

Elective Units B

BSBWRT411

Write complex documents

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to plan, draft and finalise complex documents.

BSBLEG522

Apply legal principles in contract law matters

This unit provides the skills and knowledge required to analyse and evaluate information from a variety of sources and supply solutions to contractual issues in a legal environment.

PSPMGT006

Develop a business case

This unit provides the skills required to perform market analysis, development, and cost options, and justify for a recommended business solution.

BSBSTR601

Manage innovation and continuous improvement

This unit applies to individuals with managerial responsibilities who aim to build a better and more effective work environment. Continuous improvement and innovation have links with the model of the learning organisation and people working at this level play an important role in building the culture, values and attitudes of the organisation.

BSBPRC501

Manage procurement strategies

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to develop, implement and evaluate an organisation's procurement strategies. It applies to individuals focussing on the development, design and implementation of strategies to support the procurement of goods and/ or services. While an individual may work closely with other staff members in the organisation, they have individual responsibility and autonomy to develop, communicate and implement organisational procurement strategies.

Our courses are self-directed online programs which rely heavily on text-based resources to support study.

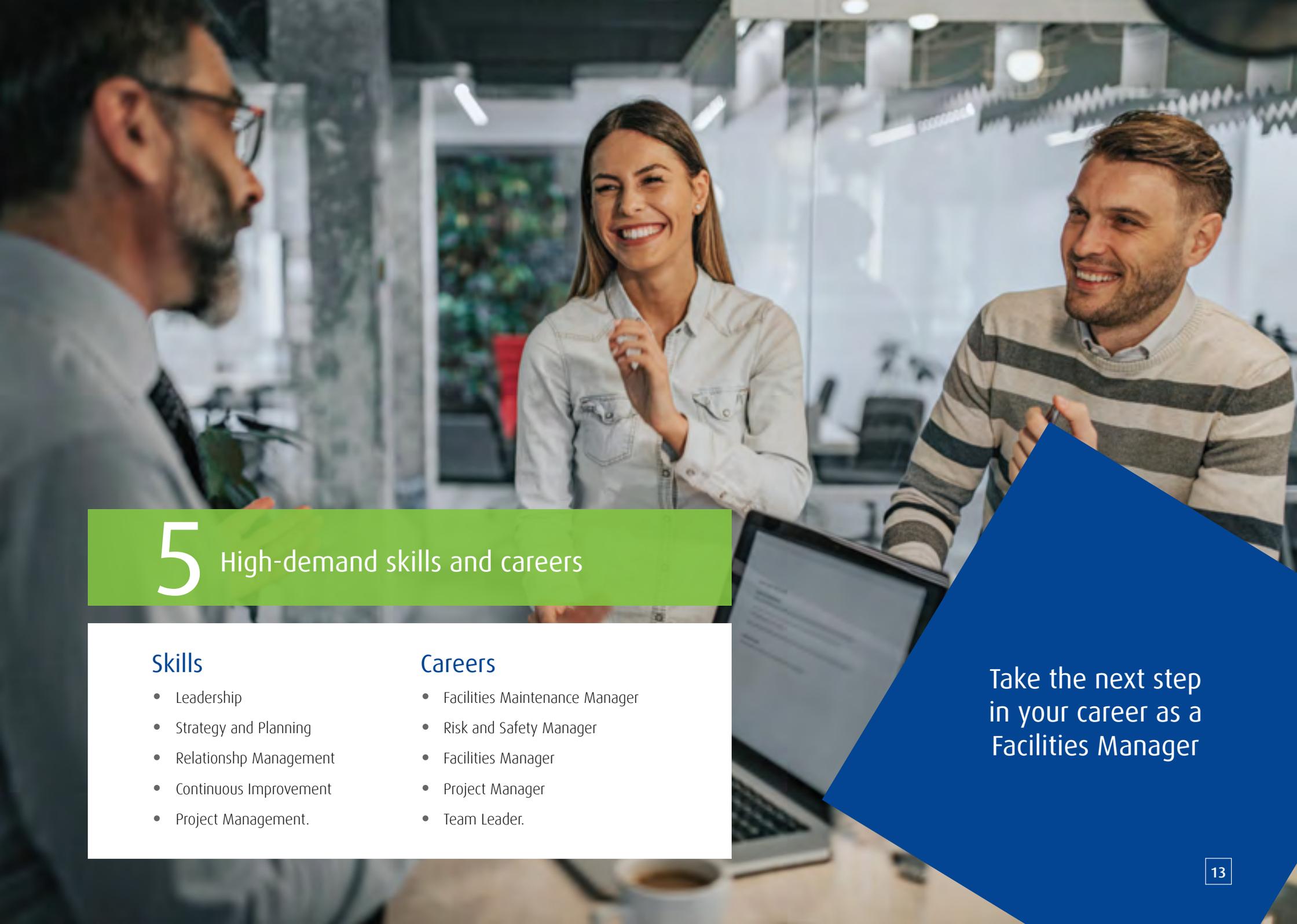
All students will need:
